# New Business: Annual Meeting

### **Chester Creek Outfall 07**

Jeff from WMS performed an assessment of the storm sewer lines tied to Chester Creek Outfall 07. They generally follow Ingra and Gambell up to 15<sup>th</sup>. They do not drain the east side of the Seward Hwy. In the sampling performed in September the outfall had a fecal coliform number of 1000. The storm sewer manholes upgradient were tested and the number ranged from 50 to 2500. There was no clear indicator of a source contamination problem in any of the manholes. The most likely candidate in the contributing area was a landscaping firm, but there was no indication of either sediment or bacteria coming from the site.

#### Informational Items

**Update on DEC actions and priorities** 

William indicates they are in a lull, as all Alaska permits are active. The Fairbanks rewrite will start next year. They are finishing work on the airport permit, and it should be available shortly.

ADEC recently went through a Total Quality Management – Lean Management program and, based on the outcomes, has made some adjustments to business activities. They would appreciate some feedback on the CGP process.

William introduced Catherine Beatty who will be doing an MS4 audit sometime during November, possibly around the 13<sup>th</sup>. Catherine indicated she will be contacting the permittees to request information in advance. Since EPA focused on construction, illicit discharge, and new development the focus for this audit will be on other areas of the permit, including education.

## Update on 1st year activities

#### Construction

The ADOT has 18 active NOI projects, 10 were carried over from last year, 7 were NOT'd. There will be 6 new NOIs next year. There were 2 instances of late inspection, 1 discharge (OMalley), and 2 complaints

MOA is busy this year, but is noticing fewer projects requiring NOIs PM&E is performing winter shutdown. There were lots of track-out issues this year.

# Monitoring

Dry weather is complete, wet weather is still under way. 3 out of 4 wet weather events have been sampled. This was an off year for pesticides, it will be sampled again next year. We did the snow site sampling in the spring. LID monitoring is being considered qualitatively this year.

### **New Development**

ADOT has LID projects on W. Dowling and Jewel Lake. Jewel Lake might be changed because they are not installing vault due to maintenance and ROW concerns.

MOA installed Rain Gardens on....... Additionally they installed a new vault on 46<sup>th</sup> and Folker.

The Public Hearing for the new DCM is on November 7<sup>th</sup>. The new manual includes the NOAA design storms, with a ~20% increase in storm volume.

## Maintenance

ARDSA finished fourth sweep yesterday. Nixl alerts are helping with getting parked cars moved for sweep day. Sweeping amounts are typical for the season. 200 drains are left to clean. The ESRI Collector app for has been handy for tracking work activities.

GSA finished fall sweep, and cleaned 12 structures. Working on developing fill data this year.

CBERRRSA has completed sweeping and has storm drain cleaning finished. Has collected catchbasin fill rate data.

ADOT will complete fall sweep today. Pipes were dirty this year. They have now collected three years of fill rate data. A new contract is in place. Structures are being cleaned until freeze-up.

Jeff Urbanus provided an update on changes to the stormdrain GIS mapping.
